Call to Order: President: Dirk A. Stapleton, on Saturday, October 9th, 2010, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 9:15AM at the Mitchell and Ilsley Bank, 18811 Valley View Parkway, Independence, MO.

Invocation: The invocation was given by Chaplain Romie Carr.

Presentation of Colors: Compatriots Jim Nail and David McCann presented the colors.

Pledge of Allegiance: Compatriot William Hartman led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The SAR Pledge: The SAR Pledge was given by Compatriot Chester I. Bare.

Introductions: SAR Compatriots present were James Nail, Dr. Chester I. Bare, Brian Smarker, Romie E. Carr, David McCann, Paul D. Toms, Dale Crandell, James Walden, William Hartman, and Dirk Stapleton. Guests: Guest speaker George Kapke. Total present: 11 people. 10 members and 1 guest.

Roll Call of Officers: Present were: President Dirk A. Stapleton; Vice President James Nail; Secretary Paul D. Toms; Registrar-Genealogist David McCann; Chaplain Romie E. Carr, Surgeon Dr. Chester I. Bare; Historian Brian Smarker; and Honorary Vice-President William Hartman. Officers that were not present for this meeting were Chancellor George DeLapp, Sergeant-at-Arms Donald Lewis, and Treasurer Courtney Y. Sloan, who were excused from the meeting.

Program:

1. President Dirk Stapleton presented Compatriot James Walden with his Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin. Congratulations to Compatriots Walden !
2. Mr. George Kapke was our guest speaker at the October 9, 2010 meeting. Mr. Kapke's practices his law practice with Kapke & Willerth, LLC in Lee's Summit, MO, and is also a member of the Missouri Bar Association. Mr. Kapke spoke on the selection process for judges in Missouri. He discussed about the Missouri Plan (originally the Missouri Nonpartisan Court Plan), or also known as the merit plan, or some variation, is a method for the selection of judges currently used in several other U.S. states and in other countries. The Missouri Plan is a method to combine election and appointment of judges. Under the plan, candidates for judicial vacancies are first selected by commissions. They forward a short list of names to the governor who has sixty days to select one. If the governor does not select one of these names to fill the position within those sixty days, the committee will then make the selection. At the general election soonest after the completion of one year's service, the judge must stand in a "retention election". If a majority vote against retention, the judge is removed from office, and the process starts anew. If the majority vote in favor of retention, the judge is permitted to serve a full term. and proposed changes to that process. A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Mr. Kapke after the program. In addition, President Dirk Stapleton presented Mr. Kapke with a Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin. The Harry S. Truman Chapter really appreciates his attendance as guest speaker.

Secretary's Report: Motion by David McCann, seconded by Jim Nail that the minutes be approved. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Courtney Y. Sloan was excused from the meeting. Therefore, no Treasurer report was provided. In addition, eight members have paid their dues for 2011. Membership cards were passed out to these individuals. MOSSAR is encouraging all members to pay their dues early if possible. Membership dues are due by December 31st, 2010.

Officer's Reports:

1. Vice-President Nail reported that the guest speaker in November will be Ms. Kathy Lee from the VA, who will be speaking at the November 13, 2010 meeting. John Mark Lamberetson will be our guest speaker at the December meeting. He is the Director of the National Frontier Trails Museum in Independence. His topic will be on the frontier heritage of the Independence area. MOSSAR President Clifford Olsen is scheduled to conduct the Officer Oath at the Officer Installation in January 8, 2011. He will also be our guest speaker. In addition, if any member would like to conduct a presentation on their Patriot Ancestor, please notify Vice-President Nail to schedule a meeting date. President Nail will continue to contact prospective guest speakers.
2. Registrar-Genealogist David McCann reported that we have no new approved applications. There are three new pending applications. In addition, there are two pending supplemental applications.
3. Historian Brian Smarker stated he was busy working on the Yohee Yearbook, taking photos of various events including chapter meetings, Color Guard events, etc. Please submit any photos, articles, etc. on Harry S. Truman Chapter events or members to Historian Smarker. Please let Historian Brian Smarker know if you would like to view previous Harry S. Truman Chapter Yearbooks, and he will bring them to a future meeting.

Committee Reports:

1. Awards Committee – Awards Committee Chairperson Romie Carr stated that he was in the process of mailing J.R.O.T.C. Award nomination packets to area high schools. In addition, he will issue packets to each Chapter at the next MOSSAR Quarterly Meeting on Saturday, October 30, 2010. Awards Committee Chairperson Carr also stated that MOSSAR took First Place at the NSSAR National Congress this past summer, in awarding this prestigious award to a J.R.O.T.C. Cadet from Missouri. We really appreciate the hard work that Compatriot Carr is providing to both the Harry S. Truman Chapter and to MOSSAR. In addition, if you know of any commercial business or individual that displays the American Flag properly, and you feel they deserve a Flag Certificate, please contact Compatriot Romie Carr or President Dirk Stapleton. Compatriot Carr also stated that it is important to mention the spouse of any individual nominee for a Flag Certificate. Compatriot Carr provided President Stapleton with several flag certificates, which are ready for presentation.
2. Boy Scout Scholarship Committee – Vacant. President Dirk Stapleton will send additional applications to representatives of local Councils in the Kansas City area. Boy Scout Eagle Scholarship nominations for 2010, need to be submitted by the deadline date of January 15, 2011. Please contact President Dirk Stapleton if you would like to volunteer with this program as a Committee Chairperson.

Committee Reports (Continued):

- 3. Veterans Liaison – Vice-President Jim Nail reported that he has contacted the Veterans Administration, and we will have a guest speaker from the Veterans Service Office (VSO) at the November 2010 meeting.**
- 4. M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award Committee – No report. The Chapter has received the official request for the 2010 nomination, from Compatriot Bragg Stanley, concerning the M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award. Compatriot Don Lewis is the committee chairperson for this award. The deadline date to submit the M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award for 2010 is January 15, 2011.**
- 5. Officer Nominations Committee – Vice-President Jim Nail is the committee chairperson for this committee. Vice-President Jim Nail stated that he has received several nominations for Officer positions. He encourages all members to become more active in our chapter, and to pursue a position as an Officer. The deadline date to submit a new slate of 2011 Officer Nominations is November 13, 2010. An Election of 2011 Officers is tentatively planned for December 11, 2010, and the Installation of 2011 Officers is tentatively planned for January 8, 2011.**
- 6. Fourth of July Luncheon Committee – Vice-President Nail provided an update concerning the plans for the 2011 Fourth of July Luncheon. After discussion on possible dates for the 2011 Fourth of July Luncheon, a motion was made to hold this event on Saturday, June 25th, 2011 at 11:45 AM. The motion carried and was approved. This date does not appear to conflict with the 121st NSSAR National Congress. Vice-President Nail provided suggestions on possible locations to include Ophelia's and Cafe Verona in Independence, MO. Vice-President Nail will follow up with these restaurants for additional information concerning menu selection, pricing of menu items, and room availability. In addition, guest speakers need to be considered for this event. President Stapleton stated that we need to finalize our plans by March 2011 if possible.**
- 7. Service Projects Committee – Vacant. President Stapleton discussed that there may be an opportunity for the Harry S. Truman Chapter to conduct a service project at the Franklin Cemetery on Old Blue Mills Road, in Independence, MO. Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is buried in this cemetery. His grave marker is in need of repair, as it is in several pieces. President Stapleton discussed of several possibilities including the request of a VA Grave Marker, since the original grave marker is deteriorated. In addition, a grave marker dedication could possibly be planned for the spring or summer of 2011, if the restoration is successful. Additional research and documentation on Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is needed before the project can be approved and completed by the Harry S. Truman Chapter. Documentation is still pending.**
- 8. Harry S. Truman Chapter Web Site Committee – President Dirk Stapleton stated that we have established a Chapter web site to promote REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI. This web site recognizes American Revolutionary War soldiers buried within 100 Miles of the Kansas City geographical area. We have a lot of work remaining. Compatriot Crandell has taken on the project to scan photos and type biographical information for these patriots. In the near future, additional site visits will be scheduled to visit gravesites of patriots in order to gain more information and take photos of the grave markers. Compatriot Grover, Compatriot Smarker, Compatriot Crandell, and Compatriot Stapleton have volunteered to conduct these site visits. It is our hope and aspiration, that electronic media, such as DVD's, can be distributed to the NSSAR, MOSSAR, and the local community. In addition, any Compatriot interested in adding information on their ancestor, should contact President Dirk Stapleton. There is a web page specifically dedicated to members of the Harry S. Truman Chapter and their Revolutionary War ancestors. This web site provides information on their Revolution War ancestor and their contributions. President Stapleton also stated that Dale Crandell's request to have his ancestor Patriot Jacob Hubbs, and the picture of Jacob's tombstone, has been added to the Harry S. - 9. Harry S. Truman Chapter Publicity Committee – No report. As the chairperson for this committee, Compatriot Grover places information concerning the monthly meeting notice in the Independence Examiner. Compatriot Grover also worked very hard this past month to publicize the SAR, especially by setting up a booth at "The Wall That Heals" event in Blue Springs, MO on September 30–October 3, 2010. We appreciate his inspiration and commitment in setting up the Harry S. Truman Chapter Recruiting Booth event. Along with Compatriot Grover, Compatriots Dale Edwards, David McCann, Jim Nail, and Dirk Stapleton also volunteered their time to pass out pamphlets, and discuss information with prospective SAR members on becoming a member of the SAR. Stapleton for their participation in this event. Compatriot Grover has also setup a SAR display at the Midwest Genealogy Center by the doorway. This is a great display, and we encourage members to please see it the next time you are at the Midwest Genealogy Center.

10. Josiah Fogg Award Committee – Historian Brian Smarker, as the new Chairperson for this committee, is working hard on the Josiah Fogg Award Scoring Sheet, in order to keep monthly activities organized.

11. Book Donation to the NSSAR Library Committee - Vacant. Compatriot McCann provided a recommendation for the next book donation. He stated the Chapter may want to consider a new book being published here locally. The book is called "Elmwood Cemetery: Stories of Kansas City", which is a 240-page book, packed with color photographs. 3. President Dirk Stapleton asked Chancellor George DeLapp to review the Harry S. Truman Chapter Bylaws at the June 2010 meeting, to see if he had any recommendations for amendments or revisions, since the bylaws should be reviewed periodically. Chancellor George DeLapp stated that he had one recommendation, as an amendment to the bylaws, in regards to email etiquette among each member. Per the date of 1992, as reflected in the bylaws, the internet and email did not exist. Each member received a copy of the Proposed Amendment Article – Members Conduct in the August minutes. The proposed amendment has been provided to MOSSAR Chancellor Richard Bryant for further review and recommendations, prior to any motion to accept this proposed amendment. No response has been received from Chancellor Bryant on his review of this proposed bylaw.

9. It was suggested at the MOSSAR Quarterly meeting on July 31, 2010 that the Treasurer send yearly Membership dues in the fall versus waiting until November or December of each year. Although Membership Dues are due no later than December 31, 2010, it is highly encouraged that dues be paid as soon as possible. In fact, the Harry S. Truman Chapter receives additional points for the Fogg Award each year concerning members who pay early. In addition, if you are attending a meeting, it also saves the Chapter on postage expenses, since the Treasurer does not have to mail the Membership Dues Statement to members who can attend a meeting. 11. A motion was made and approved at the September meeting to reimburse Compatriot Grover for his expenses in reproducing two brochures. Compatriot Grover has provided his receipts for reimbursement to President Stapleton concerning the cost to reproduce two SAR Recruiting Brochures. The brochures were handed out at the SAR Recruiting booth at "The Wall that Heals" event. The handouts included:
 - A. "SAR Whats" – Two-sided printing. Dimension 7" x 8 1/2" Can put on 14" x 8 1/2" print 500 get 1,000 for \$15.00 plus tax.
 - B. "Pride in Ancestry" – The Chapter approved this two or three years ago. This is one side printing. Compatriot Grover had very few left. He needed 1,000 brochures. In addition, Compatriot Grover provided a coupon for the UPS store with three cents a copy. Otherwise, it would have been eight cents a copy plus tax. Treasurer Courtney Sloan will be requested at the November 2010 meeting on the status of this reimbursement.
12. President Stapleton states that it is not too early to begin "planning" the ceremony to honor a Medal of Honor Recipient buried in the Kansas City area. The United States Congress has designated March 25th of each year as NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY, a day dedicated to Medal of Honor recipients. (Public Law 101-564). Truman Chapter, the event should be held on Friday, 25 March 2011. We should have approval of the local cemetery in which the ceremony will take place. Compatriot Bill Groth, MOSSAR Chairperson for the Annual Medal of Honor Day, can provide a draft proclamation that may be used by local Politian's, which probably could be issued the 1st week or so of March. Compatriot Groth also has a draft of the ceremony, and the Recipient's Citation. The ceremony can include a rifle salute (contact local government official for required permits if necessary) and placing of a wreath.
