<u>Call to Order:</u> President: Dirk A. Stapleton, on Saturday, November 13th, 2010, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 9:15AM at the Mitchell and Ilsley Bank, 18811 Valley View Parkway, Independence, MO.

**Invocation:** The invocation was given by President Dirk A. Stapleton.

Presentation of Colors: Compatriots Robert L. Grover and David McCann presented the colors.

Pledge of Allegiance: Compatriot George DeLapp led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The SAR Pledge: The SAR Pledge was given by Compatriot Chester I. Bare.

Introductions: SAR Compatriots present were James Nail, Dr. Chester I. Bare, Brian Smarker, David McCann, Courtney Y. Sloan, Paul D. Toms, George DeLapp, Robert L. Grover, Dale Crandell, James G. Walden, James K. Walden, William Hartman, Donald Lewis, Harry Dexheimer, and Dirk Stapleton. Guests: Guest speaker Kathy Lee. Total present: 16 people. 15 members and 1 guest. Roll Call of Officers: Present were: President Dirk A. Stapleton; Vice President James Nail; Secretary

Paul D. Toms; Treasurer Courtney Y. Sloan, Registrar-Genealogist David McCann; Chancellor George DeLapp; Surgeon Dr. Chester I. Bare; Historian Brian Smarker; Sergeant-at-Arms Donald Lewis, and Honorary Vice-President William Hartman. Officers that were not present for this meeting were Chaplain Romie E. Carr who was excused from the meeting.

#### **Program:**

- 1. President Dirk Stapleton presented Compatriot James Kendall Walden with a Supplemental Certificate on his patriot ancestor, Phillip Bushong. President Stapleton also presented Compatriot James Kendall Walden with his Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin. Congratulations to Compatriot Walden!
- 2. Per request of Compatriot Donald Lewis, President Stapleton presented Compatriot Lewis, with a NSSAR Membership Certificate for his son Michael Lewis, who is a member of the Independence Patriots. Compatriot Donald Lewis is a member of the Independence Patriots and dual member of the Harry S. Truman Chapter. Since Compatriot Michael Lewis is unable to attend SAR meetings, President Stapleton accommodated Compatriot Donald Lewis's request. The Harry S. Truman Chapter would also like to thank President James Scott, Independence Patriots, in accommodating this request.
- 3. President Stapleton presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Mr. John Bucher, M & I Branch Manager, for his support in allowing the Harry S. Truman Chapter to conduct monthly business meetings at their branch location. President Stapleton also presented Mr. Bucher with a Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin.
- 4. Ms. Kathy Lee was our guest speaker at the November 13, 2010 meeting. Ms. Lee is the Veterans Service Officer (VSO) for the Department of Missouri Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States. Ms. Lee discussed current topics that veterans are facing, and also provided information on pension benefits and entitlements to both veterans and surviving spouses of veterans. Ms. Lee is a veteran of the Vietnam War, and provided some of her experiences during this period. Ms. Lee also provided her point of contact information and handouts to members. A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Ms. Lee after the program. In addition, President Dirk Stapleton presented Ms. Lee with a Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin. The Harry S. Truman Chapter really appreciates her attendance as guest speaker. President Stapleton also provided members with the current Harry S. Truman Chapter Membership roster, which is dated October 30, 2010. Please let President Stapleton know if corrections are necessary on the membership roster.

### Officer's Reports:

- 1. Vice-President Nail reported that the guest speaker in December will be Mr. John Mark Lamberetson, who will be speaking at the December 11, 2010 meeting. Mr. Lamberetson is the Director of the National Frontier Trails Museum in Independence. His topic will be on the frontier heritage of the Independence area. MOSSAR President Clifford Olsen is scheduled to conduct the Officer Oath at the Officer Installation in January 8, 2011. He will also be our guest speaker. In addition, if any member would like to conduct a presentation on their Patriot Ancestor, please notify Vice-President Nail to schedule a meeting date. President Nail will continue to contact prospective guest speakers.
- 2. Registrar-Genealogist David McCann reported that we have six new approved applications. There are six new pending applications. In addition, there are three pending supplemental applications. Currently, we have 52 Active members and six Prospective members.
- 3. A) Historian Brian Smarker stated he was busy working on the Yohee Yearbook, taking photos of various events including chapter meetings, Color Guard events, etc. Please submit any photos, articles, etc. on Harry S. Truman Chapter events or members to Historian Smarker. Please let Historian Brian Smarker know if you would like to view previous Harry S. Truman Chapter Yearbooks, and he will bring them to a future meeting.

- B) President Stapleton presented Historian Brian Smarker with a directory on the Fort Osage Pioneer Cemetery, which is titled "Sibley (Fort Osage) Pioneer Cemetery 1809-1989". The Fort Osage Pioneer Cemetery is located south of Fort Osage in Sibley, MO. This directory was published by the Harry S. Truman Chapter, in which it was compiled by edited by Harry S. Truman Chapter Compatriot Harry Dexheimer. Compatriot Dexheimer and his wife Inez M. Dexheimer, were able to write the directory from his field notes. The directory contains information on the history of the oldest cemetery in Jackson County. The manuscript provided an overview of the many remarkable people who are interred in this historic cemetery, the earliest being soldiers who were stationed at Fort Osage in 1810. During the winter of 1819-1820, over forty soldiers sickened by scurvy arrived at Fort Osage, a fort and factory trading post located by the Missouri River in Jackson County, Missouri. Despite attempts to save them, all the soldiers died. The soldiers stationed at Fort Osage dug a trench grave for the dead, creating a large unmarked mass grave. Historian Smarker will maintain this manuscript in the Harry S. Truman Chapter archives for future reference. Compatriot Dexheimer provided comments at the meeting on his efforts to prepare this manuscript. Compatriot Dexheimer and Historian Smarker were present for the presentation and photos taken after the presentation.
- 4. Color Guard report: Color Guard Commander Robert Grover reported on recent events that the Harry S. Truman Chapter Color Guard participated in the past month. Some of these events included the Trail to Fort Osage DAR Marker Ceremony, at the Fort Osage Education Center in Fort Osage, Missouri, on Sunday, October 31, 2010. Members of the WWII Veterans Honor Flight were also greeted at the Kansas City International Airport on Wednesday, November 3, 2010. Color Guard Commander Grover stated that the Harry S. Truman Chapter Color Guard also attended the Vietnam Memorial Service, 43rd & Broadway, Kansas City, MO. on Veterans Day. A Flag Certificate was presented to Gary and Sue Adcock by the Harry S. Truman chapter Color Guard on Veterans Day. Also, please see the enclosed November 2010 Color Guard report for upcoming and past events for 2010. President Dirk Stapleton presented a Certificate of Appreciation to Compatriot Grover, in recognition to him for attending the Vietnam Memorial Service event. The Certificate of Appreciation was provided by Chapter 317, Heart of America Chapter, Vietnam Veterans of America. In addition, Compatriot Grover also presented President Dirk Stapleton with a Certificate of Appreciation for his attendance in this event.

### **Committee Reports:**

- 1. Awards Committee Awards Committee Chairperson Romie Carr. No report. Compatriot Carr issued ROTC Award Packets to Compatriot Grover at the MOSSAR Quarterly Meeting on Saturday, October 30, 2010. - 2. Boy Scout Scholarship Committee Vacant. President Dirk Stapleton will send additional applications to representatives of local Councils in the Kansas City area. Boy Scout Eagle Scholarship nominations for 2010, need to be submitted by the deadline date of January 15, 2011. Please contact President Dirk Stapleton if you would like to volunteer with this program as a Committee Chairperson.
- 3. Veterans Liaison Vice-President Jim Nail reported that he appreciated Ms. Kathy Lee as the guest speaker from the VFW Veterans Service Office (VSO) at the November 2010 meeting. Vice-President Nail also reported on local activities that were held by Veterans organizations on Veterans Day, as well as the restaurants and various stores that are showing their support for veterans.
- 4. M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award Committee Compatriot Don Lewis is the committee chairperson for this award. The Chapter has received the official request for the 2010 nomination, from Compatriot Bragg Stanley, concerning the M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award. Compatriot Lewis stated he has contacted Mr. Fleck concerning his nomination for this award and is awaiting Mr. Fleck's reply. President Stapleton stated he will also follow up with Mr. Fleck to see if he is interested in this nomination. The deadline date to submit the M. Graham Clark Teacher of the Year Award for 2010 is January 15, 2011.
- 5. Officer Nominations Committee Vice-President Jim Nail is the committee chairperson for this committee. Vice-President Jim Nail stated that he has received several nominations for Officer positions. He encourages all members to become more active in our chapter, and to pursue a position as an Officer. The deadline date to submit a new slate of 2011 Officer Nominations was November 13, 2010. An Election of 2011 Officers is tentatively planned for December 11, 2010, and the Installation of 2011 Officers is tentatively planned for January 8, 2011.

**Committee Reports (Continued):** 

- 6. Fourth of July Luncheon Committee Vice-President Nail provided an update concerning the plans for the 2011 Fourth of July Luncheon. The 2011 Fourth of July Luncheon will be on Saturday, June 25th, 2011 at 11:45 AM. Vice-President Nail reported that Ophelia's does not have a private room to conduct this luncheon. Vice-President Nail suggested that V's Italiano Ristorante 10819 East 40 Highway, Independence, MO 64055; has two rooms and will allow us more time to set up earlier in the morning prior to the luncheon. Vice-President Nail will follow up with this restaurant for additional information concerning menu selection, pricing of menu items, and room availability. In addition, Vice-President Nail is in the process of contacting potential guest speakers to be considered for this event. President Stapleton stated that we need to finalize our plans by March 2011 if possible.
- 7. Service Projects Committee Vacant. President Stapleton discussed that there may be an opportunity for the Harry S. Truman Chapter to conduct a service project at the Franklin Cemetery on Old Blue Mills Road, in Independence, MO. Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is buried in this cemetery. His grave marker is in need of repair, as it is in several pieces. President Stapleton discussed of several possibilities including the request of a VA Grave Marker, since the original grave marker is deteriorated. In addition, a grave marker dedication could possibly be planned for the spring or summer of 2011, if the restoration is successful. Additional research and documentation on Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is needed before the project can be approved and completed by the Harry S. Truman Chapter. Documentation is still pending. President Stapleton has requested Independence Pioneers Regent Joann Walker for additional information and coordination for this event. Compatriot Grover also mentioned that a future service project should be considered for Revolutionary War Patriot William Moore, on a farm formerly known as the Grinter Farm in Lee's Summit, MO. The farm is now owned by Hans Dierks. This cemetery is North of the new Jackson County Neurological Center on Little Blue Road, about 300 feet and over the dividing fence. It is surrounded by a chain-link fence, and is about 60 x 100. In 1989, there was only one monument in the enclosure:

- 8. Harry S. Truman Chapter Web Site Committee Compatriot Dale Crandell provided a report concerning the Chapter web site in promoting REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI. This web site recognizes American Revolutionary War soldiers buried within 100 Miles of the Kansas City geographical area. We have a lot of work remaining. Compatriot Crandell has taken on the project to scan photos and type biographical information for these patriots. In the near future, additional site visits will be scheduled to visit gravesites of patriots in order to gain more information and take photos of the grave markers. Compatriot Grover, Compatriot Smarker, Compatriot Crandell, and Compatriot Stapleton have volunteered to conduct these site visits. It is our hope and aspiration, that electronic media, such as DVD's, can be distributed to the NSSAR, MOSSAR, and the local community. In addition, any Compatriot interested in adding information on their ancestor, should contact President Dirk Stapleton. There is a web page specifically dedicated to members of the Harry S. We should have approval of the local cemetery in which the ceremony will take place. Compatriot Bill Groth, MOSSAR Chairperson for the Annual Medal of Honor Day, can provide a draft proclamation that may be used by local Politian's, which probably could be issued the 1st week or so of March.
