**Call to Order:** *President: Dirk A. Stapleton, on Saturday, December 11th, 2010, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 9:15AM at the Mitchell and Ilesley Bank, 18811 Valley View Parkway, Independence, MO.*

**Invocation:** The invocation was given by Compatriot Romie Carr.

**Presentation of Colors:** Compatriot Robert L. Grover presented the colors.

**Pledge of Allegiance:** Compatriot George DeLapp led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**The SAR Pledge:** The SAR Pledge was given by Compatriot Chester I. Bare.

**Introductions:** SAR Compatriots present were Dr. Chester I. Bare, David McCann, Courtney Y. Sloan, Romie E. Carr, Paul D. Toms, George DeLapp, Robert L. Grover, Dale Crandell, Donald Lewis, Jr., Dale Edwards, and Dirk Stapleton. Guests: Perry (Bud) Marks, Gloria Dohs, Barry A. Henson, Sam Henson, and Guest speaker John Mark Lambertson. Total present: 16 people. 11 members and 5 guests.

**Roll Call of Officers:** Present were: President Dirk A. Stapleton; Secretary Paul D. Toms; Treasurer Courtney Y. Sloan, Registrar-Genealogist David McCann; Chancellor George DeLapp; Surgeon Dr. Chester I. Bare; and Sergeant-at-Arms Donald Lewis. Officers that were not present for this meeting were Vice-President James Nail, Historian Brian Smarker, and Honorary Vice-President William Hartman, who were excused from the meeting.

**Program:**

1. President Dirk Stapleton presented Compatriot Dale Edwards with a Certificate of Appreciation for his participation with the SAR Recruiting Booth at "The Wall That Heals" event in Blue Springs, MO on September 30–October 3, 2010. We appreciate his dedication in attending this event each day. Along with Compatriot Dale Edwards, Compatriots Robert L. Grover, David McCann, Jim Nail, and Dirk Stapleton also volunteered their time to pass out pamphlets, and discuss information with prospective SAR members on becoming a member of the SAR.
2. Mr. John Mark Lambertson was our guest speaker at the December 11, 2010 meeting. Mr. Lambertson is the Director of the National Frontier Trails Museum in Independence. His topic was on the frontier heritage of the Independence area. Mr. Lambertson provided information on the three principle trails which crossed the West, which were the Santa Fe, Oregon, and California. The Santa Fe Trail, begun in 1821, was a 900-mile foreign trade route unique in American History due to its overland rather than seafaring commerce. The 2,000-mile Oregon Trail began to be heavily traveled in 1843 by settlers wanting to establish new homes in the northwest, while others forked off on the equally long and grueling California Trail to seek their fortunes in the gold fields. Together, these three rugged pathways and their pioneers changed the face and history of America. The National Frontier Trails Museum is a museum, interpretive center, and research library dedicated to telling the rich history of America's principle western trails. The National Frontier Trails Museum is located at 318 W. Pacific in Independence, Missouri. A Certificate of Appreciation was presented to Mr. Lambertson after the program. In addition, President Dirk Stapleton presented Mr. Lambertson with a Harry S. Truman Chapter Coin. The Harry S. Truman Chapter really appreciates his attendance as guest speaker.

7. Service Projects Committee – Vacant. Compatriot McCann stated that he is working with a local heating and sheet metal firm to create a stainless steel sleeve for the gravestone of Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin. This sleeve will be donated by this firm. President Stapleton discussed that there may be an opportunity for the Harry S. Truman Chapter to conduct a service project at the Franklin Cemetery on Old Blue Mills Road, in Independence, MO. Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is buried in this cemetery. His grave marker is in need of repair, as it is in several pieces. President Stapleton discussed of several possibilities including the request of a VA

Grave Marker, since the original grave marker is deteriorated. In addition, a grave marker dedication could possibly be planned for the spring or summer of 2011, if the restoration is successful. Additional research and documentation on Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is needed before the project can be approved and completed by the Harry S. Truman Chapter. Documentation is still pending. President Stapleton has requested Independence Pioneers Regent Joann Walker for additional information and coordination for this event. Compatriot Grover also mentioned that a future service project should be considered for Revolutionary War Patriot William Moore, on a farm formerly known as the Grinter Farm in Lee's Summit, MO. The farm is now owned by Hans Dierks. This cemetery is North of the new Jackson County Neurological Center on Little Blue Road, about 300 feet and over the dividing fence. It is surrounded by a chain-link fence, and is about 60 x 100. In 1989, there was only one monument in the enclosure:

Enlisted Feb. 14, 1776 in Col. Morgan's Virginia Regiment

8. Harry S. Truman Chapter Web Site Committee – Compatriot Dale Crandell provided a report concerning the Chapter web site in promoting REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI. This web site recognizes American Revolutionary War soldiers buried within 100 Miles of the Kansas City geographical area. We have a lot of work remaining. Compatriot Crandell has taken on the project to scan photos and type biographical information for these patriots. In the near future, additional site visits will be scheduled to visit gravesites of patriots in order to gain more information and take photos of the grave markers. Compatriot Grover, Compatriot Smarker, Compatriot Crandell and Compatriot Stapleton have volunteered to conduct these site visits. It is our hope and aspiration, that electronic media, such as DVD's, can be distributed to the NSSAR, MOSSAR and the local community. In addition, any Compatriot interested in adding information on their ancestor, should contact President Dirk Stapleton. There is a web page specifically dedicated to members of the Harry S. Truman Chapter and their Revolutionary War ancestors. This web site provides information on their Revolution War ancestor and their contributions. 3. President Dirk Stapleton asked Chancellor George DeLapp to review the Harry S. 9. President Stapleton states that it is not too early to begin "planning" the ceremony to honor a Medal of Honor Recipient buried in the Kansas City area. The United States Congress has designated March 25<sup>th</sup> of each year as NATIONAL MEDAL OF HONOR DAY, a day dedicated to Medal of Honor recipients. (Public Law 101-564). March 25<sup>th</sup> was selected as the date because it is the date of the first presentation of the award 157 years ago. You can read more about it here at <http://www.cmohs.org/>. If approved by the Harry S. Truman Chapter; the event should be held on Friday, 25 March 2011. We should have approval of the local cemetery in which the ceremony will take place. Compatriot Bill Groth, MOSSAR Chairperson for the Annual Medal of Honor Day, can provide a draft proclamation that may be used by local Politian's, which probably could be issued the 1st week or so of March. Compatriot Groth also has a draft of the ceremony, and the Recipient's Citation. The ceremony can include a rifle salute (contact local government official for required permits if necessary) and placing of a wreath.

10. Compatriot Bill Groth, MOSSAR Veteran's Chair, has requested Chapters to participate in Wreaths Across America. For the past two (2) years, the Wreaths Across America has been part of NSSAR Patriotic Events. The date for 2010 will be: 11 December 2010, with the event beginning at: 11:00 am CST.
