

Patriot William O'Reer Columbia, Missouri 1761-1839

William O'Reer assisted in establishing American Independence as a Private, Coronel Clark's Illinois Regiment, Virginia Militia.


William (son of John O'Reer III and Hester Malinda Renoe) was born 1 December 1761, Prince William County, Virginia; died 30 June 1839, Columbia, Boone County, Missouri; and buried Columbia Cemetery, Columbia, Boone County, Missouri. William married Ann Calk on 27 March 1786, Boonesborough, Kentucky. Ann (daughter of William Calk



and Sarah Elizabeth Cartlett) was born 20 June 1764, Prince William County, Virginia; died 13 February 1846, Columbia, Boone County, Missouri; and buried adjacent to William, Columbia Cemetery. Children:

Columbia Cemetery is a public cemetery located at 30 East Broadway, Columbia, Boone County, Missouri at coordinates: N38° 56' 57.84" W94° 20' 11.04". He has a military tombstone. It is gravesite #2 on the cemetery's walking map, located southwest of the intersection of Garth and Banks.
