<u>Call to Order:</u> President: Dirk A. Stapleton, on Saturday, March 13th, 2010, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 9:15AM at the Mitchell and Ilsley Bank, 18811 Valley View Parkway, Independence, MO.

Presentation of Colors: Compatriots Robert L. Grover and James Nail presented the colors.

<u>Pledge of Allegiance</u>: Compatriot George DeLapp led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The SAR Pledge: The SAR Pledge was given by Compatriot William Hartman.

Officers that were not present for this meeting were Surgeon Dr. Chester I. Bare and Historian Brian Smarker. Both officers were excused from this meeting.

Program:

- 1. Prior to the program, Harry S. Truman Chapter President Dirk A. Stapleton presented two new members to the chapter, which included Richard G. Hogan and Paul D. Toms. Each new member participated in their Membership induction ceremony, and also shared some history of their patriot ancestors. Each new member received their SAR Membership certificate and SAR Rosette during the ceremony. Welcome gentlemen!
- 2. In addition, Compatriot James G. Walden received a Meritorious Service Award and certificate. Compatriot Walden has been the Harry S. Truman Chapter Sergeant-of-Arms, for the past eight years. Compatriot Walden was first elected in 2002 to this office. Thank you Compatriot Walden for your dedication and tireless service.
- 3. Harry S. Truman Chapter President Dirk A. Stapleton also presented Chancellor George DeLapp with the Silver MOSSAR Medal and Certificate. - 1. Vice-President Nail reported that Mrs. Crystal Greer is scheduled to be our guest speaker at the April 10, 2010 meeting, in which she will be conducting a presentation on Civil War Medicine.
- 2. Registrar-Genealogist David McCann reported that that there are no prospective new members or pending supplemental applications.
- 3. Color Guard Commander Robert Grover reported on several items discussed at the National Leadership / Trustee meeting held on March 4-6, 2010 in Louisville, KY. Some of the items included consideration in donating to the SAR, which can be included in your will. He also reported on statistics on current membership, applications approved, Boy Scout Scholarship applications, judging State newsletters, the Wounded Warrior Medal, emailing State newsletters, and sending the "NSSAR Keyhole to History" CD to local radio stations. A Color Guard report was also provided by Compatriot Grover, including the GWBC event. A status on "SAR Whats" brochure was provided.

Committee Reports:

- 1. Awards Committee Compatriot Romie Carr reported on J.R.O.T.C. Awards. All schools in our area for the Harry S. Truman Chapter have been sent documentation on submitting nominations for Military Professors to review. Compatriot Carr stated that Hickman Mills High School is the only school that has submitted an Enhanced R.O.T.C. Award recommendation. The Awards Committee recommended to the Harry S.  - E) Submits news releases in typewritten form.
 - F) Checks accuracy of all information (dates, times, locations) before release.
 - G) Acknowledges due credit.
 - H) Issues releases of pertinent information as briefly as possible.
- I) Invites representatives of the news media to special events, but are not expected to pay reservation fees, meal charges or any such expenses.

- President Stapleton provided a final draft of the coin, complements of Compatriot Will Carr, a member of the Ozark Mountain Chapter. President Stapleton will contact the vendor, KB Line, in submitting the proposed design. KB Line is located in San Clemente, CA and provided a quote of \$324.00 plus an estimated shipping cost of \$35.00 for UPS Ground. The estimated total cost is \$359.00 for 100 coins. The proposed coin will be designed using Zinc Alloy, 1 1/2 inch diameter, 3mm thickness, and having an Antique Brass finish. The reverse of the coin states "Harry S. Truman Chapter of the Missouri Society" at the top of the coin; and the verbiage "Organized 4 August 1984"; "Independence, Missouri" is displayed at the bottom of the coin. The middle portion of the reverse could be used to inscribe the members name. Compatriot McCann also stated that he would contribute \$75.00 to the purchase of the first 100 coins. The Harry S. Truman Chapter would like to thank Compatriot Will Carr, who has been was very helpful.
