Call to Order: President: Dirk A. Stapleton, on Saturday, August 14th, 2010, called the Regular Monthly Meeting to order at 9:15AM at the Mitchell and Ilsley Bank, 18811 Valley View Parkway, Independence, MO.

Invocation: The invocation was given by President Dirk Stapleton.

Presentation of Colors: Compatriots Jim Nail and David McCann presented the colors.

Pledge of Allegiance: Compatriot George DeLapp led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The SAR Pledge: The SAR Pledge was given by Compatriot Courtney Sloan.

Introductions: SAR Compatriots present were James Nail, Dr. Chester I. Bare, Brian Smarker, David McCann, George DeLapp, Courtney Sloan, Paul D. Toms, Ian Krause, Donald Lewis, Jr., and Dirk Stapleton. Guests: David Krause, Regina Krause, and Jeff Hawbaker. Total present: 13 people. 10 members and 3 guests.

Roll Call of Officers: Present were: President Dirk A. Stapleton; Vice President James Nail; Secretary Paul D. Toms; Treasurer Courtney Y. Sloan; Registrar-Genealogist David McCann; Surgeon Dr. Chester I. Bare; Chancellor George DeLapp; Historian Brian Smarker; and Sergeant-at-Arms Donald Lewis, Jr. Officers that were not present for this meeting were Chaplain Romie E. Carr, who is recovering from knee surgery, and was excused from this meeting. In addition, Honorary Vice-President William Hartman was also excused from the meeting.

We applaud Compatriot Toms for pursuing this program. A Life Membership in the National Society is available to be purchased at a rate that depends on your age. At the September 2009 Executive Committee meeting the following fee scale was approved. For those eighteen (18) - forty (40) the one-time fee is \$900. The rate of decrease for those over forty (40) is \$15.00 per year. So, someone who is forty-one (41) would pay a one-time fee of \$885.00 and so on. Someone at sixty (60) years of age would pay a one-time fee of \$600. The Life Membership program covers the National dues only. Payment of the State Society's and Chapter annual dues is still required to be considered an active member of the SAR. Please see President Stapleton for a NSSAR Life Membership application.

6. The guest speaker, Ms. Kathy Lee, could not be present at the meeting on Saturday, August 14th, 2010, due to a family emergency. Ms. Lee has requested that she be rescheduled to speak at the November 13th meeting, concerning topics on services provided by the Veterans Affairs Administration. In lieu of no guest speaker, Compatriot James Nail provided a very interesting presentation on his patriot ancestor, Matthew Nail, who fought with the Georgia Militia during the Battle of Briar Creek. The Battle of Briar Creek was a tremendous set back for the American war effort in the South. The militia forces were surrounded and killed or captured. The prisoners faced terrible conditions aboard British prison ships in Savannah harbor, where the majority died in captivity. The Harry S. Truman Chapter really appreciates the presentation by Compatriot Nail on his patriot ancestor.

President Stapleton would also like to especially thank Vice-President Nail, for his coordination and support of the 2010 Fourth of July Luncheon, and making it very successful. Truman Chapter to conduct a service project at the Franklin Cemetery on Old Blue Mills Road, in Independence, MO. Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is buried in this cemetery. His grave marker is in need of repair, as it is in several pieces. President Stapleton discussed of several possibilities including the request of a VA Grave Marker, since the original grave marker is deteriorated. In addition, a grave marker dedication could possibly be planned for the spring or summer of 2011, if the restoration is successful. If the Harry S. Truman Chapter approves the service project and grave marker dedication, President Stapleton would also like to contact the Independence Pioneers DAR Chapter in participating in the Grave Marker dedication. Currently, the Independence Pioneers DAR Chapter has a DAR Marker at the site of Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr. Additional research and documentation on Revolutionary War Patriot John Franklin, Sr., is needed before the project can be approved and completed by the Harry S. Truman Chapter. Documentation is still pending.
8. Harry S. Truman Chapter Web Site Committee – President Dirk Stapleton stated that we have established a Chapter web site to promote REVOLUTIONARY WAR SOLDIERS IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI. This web site recognizes American Revolutionary War soldiers buried within 100 Miles of the Kansas City geographical area. We have a lot of work remaining. Compatriot Crandell has taken on the project to scan photos and type biographical information for these patriots. In the near future, additional site visits will be scheduled to visit gravesites of patriots in order to gain more information and take photos of the grave markers. Compatriot Grover, Compatriot Smarker, Compatriot Crandell, and Compatriot Stapleton have volunteered to conduct these site visits. It is our hope and aspiration, that electronic media, such as DVD's, can be distributed to the NSSAR, MOSSAR, and the local community. In addition, any Compatriot interested in adding information on their ancestor, should contact President Dirk Stapleton. There is a web page specifically dedicated to members of the Harry S.
