



Patriot Joseph Boggs Jackson County, Missouri 1749-1843

Joseph Boggs assisted in establishing American Independence as a Lieutenant, 1st Company, 4th Battalion, Pennsylvania Militia.

Joseph (son of William Boggs and Jane Stein) was born 20 Oct 1749, Chester County, Pennsylvania; died 22 Jan 1843, Westport, Jackson County, Missouri; and buried Union Cemetery, Kansas City, Jackson County, Missouri. Joseph married Sarah Riddle in 1773, Chester County, Pennsylvania. Sarah was born 1755 and died 1810, Madison County, Kentucky. Children:

- David Boggs (-1831).
- Jane Boggs (1775-1831).
- Rebecca Boggs (1790/1796-1837). Rebecca married David Hunt in 1821.

Union Cemetery is located at 2815 Walnut Street, Kansas City, Missouri. The cemetery is maintained by the Kansas City Parks & Recreation Department and supported by the Union Cemetery Historical Society located at 227 East 28th Terrace, Kansas City, Missouri (www.uchskc.org/home).

Joseph was originally buried at Westport Cemetery, and relocated in 1965 to Union Cemetery. Both his original and a replacement tombstone are located at the grave. It is marked as grave #23 in the east central section at coordinates: N39° 04' 29" and W94° 34' 54".
