



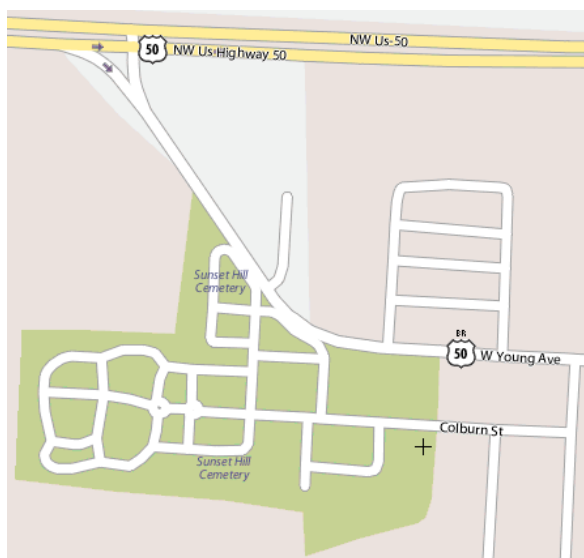
**Patriot Martin Warren
Johnson County, Missouri
1763-1852**

Martin Warren assisted in establishing American Independence as a Private, Capt John Dougherty's Company, General George Rogers Clark's Regiment, Virginia Continental Line. Private Warren fought with General George Washington at the Battle of Valley Forge. His service is documented in Margery Harding's publication *George Rogers Clark and His Men: Military Records* and as DAR patriot A121627.

Martin (son of James and Mary Warren) was born August 1763, Augusta, Virginia; died 19 Aug 1852, Warrensburg, Johnson County, Missouri; and buried Sunset Hill Cemetery, Warrensburg, Johnson County, Missouri. Martin married Sarah "Sally" Dunbar on 07 Dec 1786, Lincoln, Kentucky. Sarah was born 1767, Greenbrier County, Virginia; and died 03 Dec 1833, Lafayette County, Missouri. Children:

- James Dunbar Warren (1785-1840).
- Martin Warren Jr. (1790-1850). Martin married Nancy Hubbard.
- John Warren (1795-1879). John married Jane Dillingham.
- Anderson Warren (1798-1855). Anderson married Sarah Wilkinson.
- Thomas Chilton Warren (1802-1890). Thomas married Elizabeth Reavis.
- Madison Warren (1805-1840).
- William Warren (1807-). William married Elizabeth Wilkinson.
- Mary Margaret "Polly" Warren (1810-1834). Marry married Will Carpenter.

Martin Warren received an 80 acre land grant for his service, which he partially sold to create the Warrens Corner settlement, re-named Warrensburg, Missouri in 1836. Martin was originally buried at the Old Warrensburg Cemetery on West Gay Street, which still has his original tombstone. However, his body was moved to the Sunset Hill Cemetery in 1915 with a new military tombstone. Sunset Hill Cemetery is located at 610 Colburn Street, Warrensburg, Johnson County, Missouri. It is open to the public and maintained by the Warrensburg Cemetery Association. Martin's grave site is near the east entrance in the Civil War-GAR section at coordinates N38° 46' 13.84" and W93° 45' 07.24".
