

## Patriot Nathaniel Lewis Independence, Missouri 1736-1826


Nathaniel Lewis assisted in establishing American Independence as a Private, Capt Granberry's Company, North Carolina Troops, Continental Line. Nathaniel enlisted 10 April 1776 and was discharged October 1778 with his service is documented at the U.S. National Archives & Records Administration.

Nathaniel was born 1736, North Carolina; died 14 July 1826, Jackson County, Missouri; and buried Old Lewis Cemetery, Independence, Jackson County, Missouri. Nathaniel possibly married Urith Roberts in Rowan County, North Carolina. Children:
